We are delighted to share the outcome of our recent Ofsted inspection with you. The report recognises that Wembury Primary School provides an **expected standard of education across all areas**, with safeguarding judged to be fully effective. Inspectors highlighted the warm, caring atmosphere of the school, noting that children feel safe, happy and enjoy coming to school. They also praised the strong relationships between staff, pupils and families, and the way our curriculum helps children develop their knowledge and confidence over time.

We are particularly proud that the report reflects the positive attitudes of our pupils, their enthusiasm for learning, and the supportive community we have built together. Ofsted also identified some areas for us to continue developing, including further strengthening spelling and handwriting, ensuring consistency in behaviour expectations, and expanding enrichment opportunities. We see this as a positive next step and are already working on these areas so that every child can thrive. Thank you, as always, for your continued support—this is very much a shared success between school and families.
